OUTCOME: How many people received the treatment and prevention services that they need?

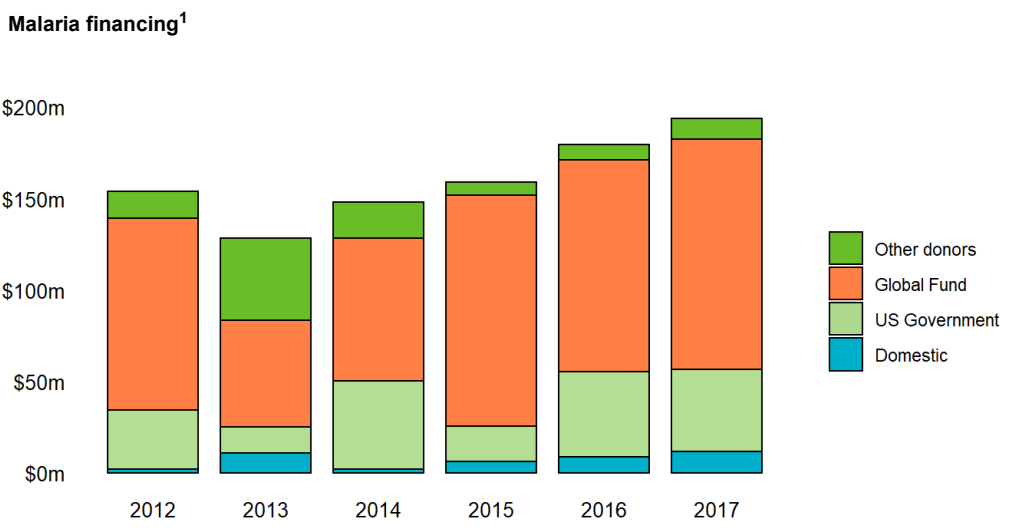
IMPACT: What is the trend among people who continue to fall ill or die? (actual and hypothetical in the absence of program)

Historical investments by funding source (2012-2017)

Global Fund investments:
 2014-2016 Allocation period
 Malaria disbursements: **\$439m**
 RSSH disbursements: **\$682k**

2017-2019 Allocation period
 Malaria disbursements: **\$146m**

In 2015-2017, **64%** of NSP need was funded.

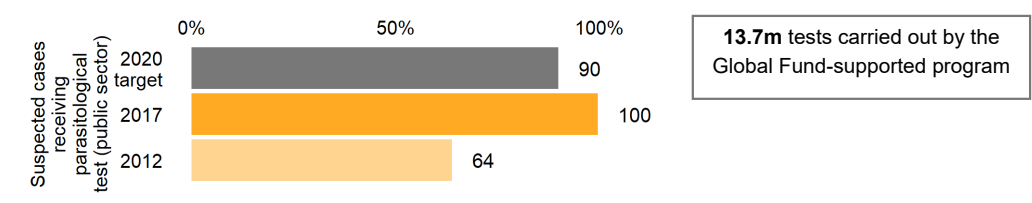
Planned investments by funding source and intervention (2018-2020)²

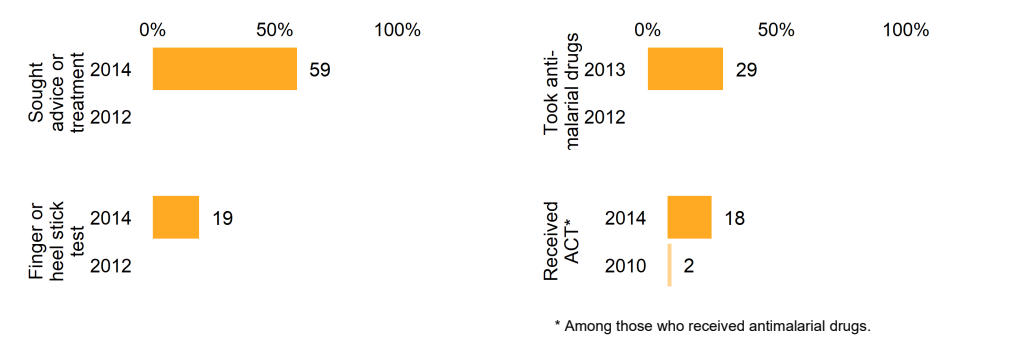
Global Fund Results (2018)

Suspected malaria cases that receive a parasitological test

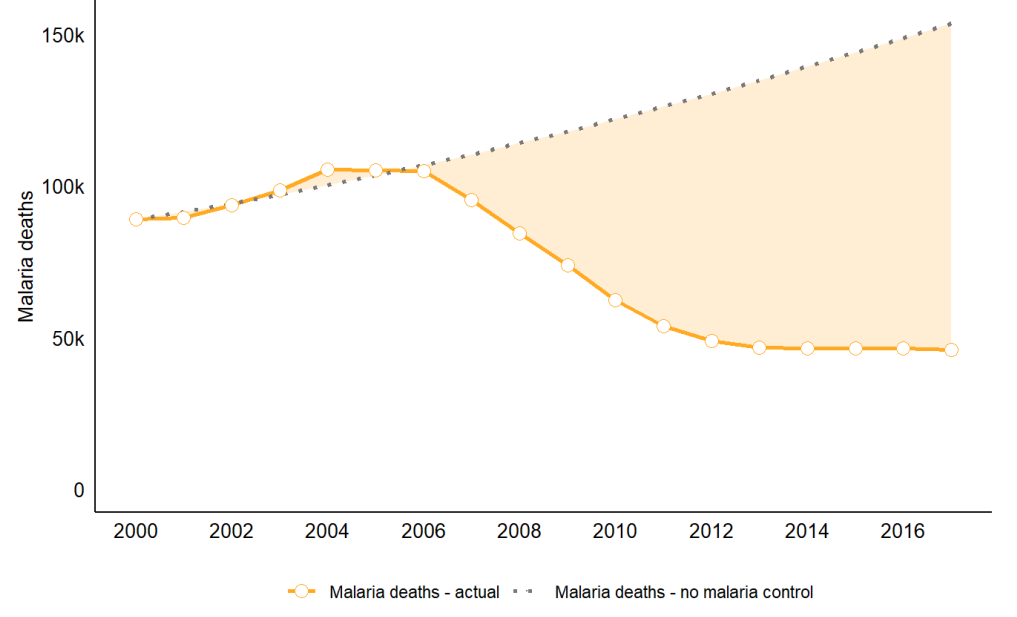


Malaria testing and treatment in children under 5 with fever in last 2 weeks



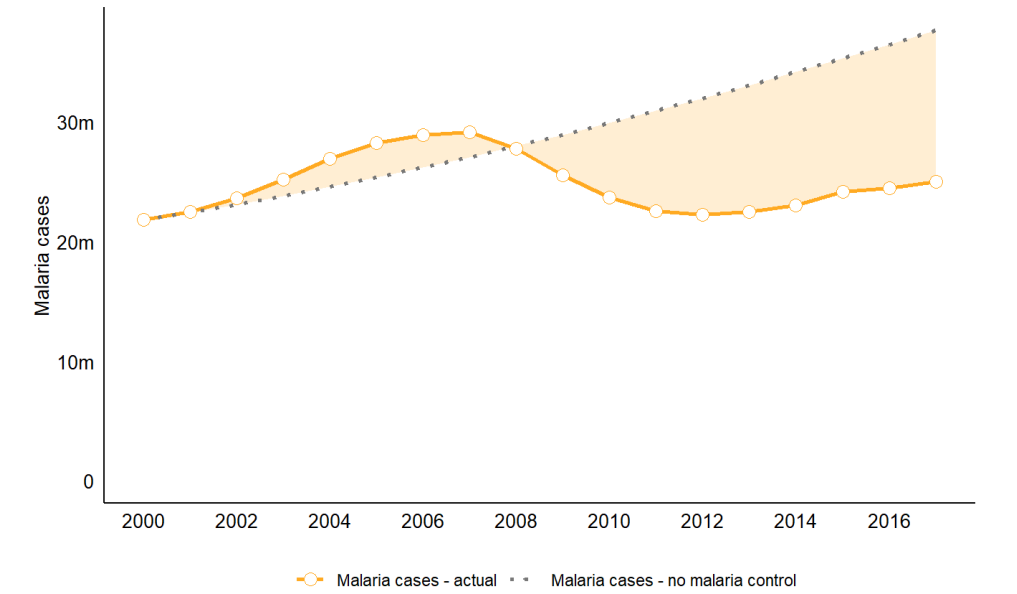
Malaria deaths

 48% reduction from 2000 to 2017

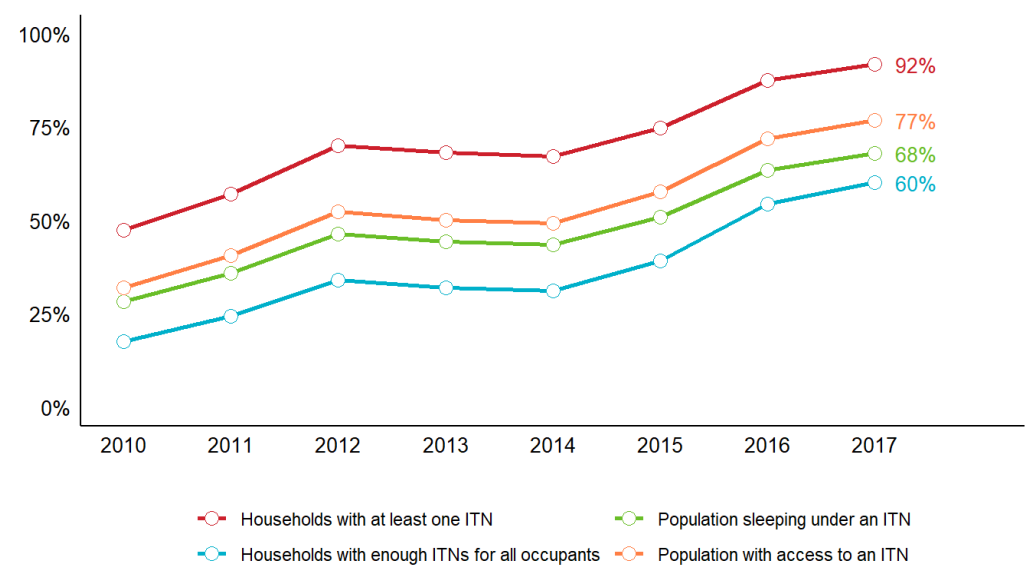


Malaria cases

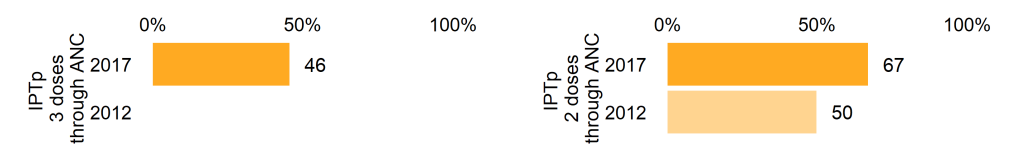
Change in malaria cases:
